





### *Q & A with 23 Year Old Andrea Santos, What Makes her Want to Succeed!*

Last month Andrea Santos washed dishes with ashes and slept on a wooden bed in a building with no heat or hot water. Santos was part of a delegation of youth selected from around the world, sponsored by the Indian government, to experience life in India. The experience gave her a new appreciation for the simple things in life. Born in Dubai, United Arab Emirates to Indian parents, she moved to Richmond at age eight. The Richmond resident is now majoring in international studies at Simon Fraser University.

Her passion for global affairs began in Grade 12 as a student in the Global Perspectives Program, which took her to Cambodia. The experience changed her life—broadening her perspective on world issues and igniting a passion for travelling.





**What was your greatest lesson in India?**

"My greatest lesson during my time in India was learning how to appreciate the little things I may take granted for in Canada."

**If you were a world leader, what's one cause you would fight for?**

"I would fight for fresh water in all developing countries because it is a basic necessity that all human beings need to survive. With the new technology that becoming available it should become more accessible to rural areas around the world. This would drastically help in decreasing the mortality rates and diseases in developing countries."

**Who inspires you?**

"My mom and dad inspire me. They both came from very humble beginnings in Mumbai, India and they have worked very hard to be able to bring my sister and I to Canada for a better future."

**What advice do you have for others?**

"Work as hard as you can, travel to experience the world and do what makes you get up in the morning."

**What does the future hold for you?**

"I would like to get a job with the federal government that will allow me to utilize my education and experience in international affairs. Once I gain work experience, I will apply my skills in working with children and changing policies to better their life. In the meantime I am exploring my creative attributes and am currently teaching art for children and pre-teens."
